## Thanksgiving Is A Call To Praise:

"Bless the Lord, O my soul; and all that is within me, bless his holy name. Bless the Lord, O my soul, and forget not all his benefits. Bless ye the Lord, all ye his hosts; ye ministers of his, that do his pleasure," Psalm 103:1,2, 21.

The Bible invites praise more than prayer. Without prayer the believer will not be a believer . . . but without praise we are not in harmony with the Word.

#### WHAT IS PRAISE?

Everything that hath breath is commanded to praise God and not only things animate, but things inanimate . . . "all deeps, firm and hail, snow and vapour; stormy wind, mountains and all hills; fruitful trees and all cedars," Psalm 148:7-9. And there are benefits too:

After a week of seeing John in low spirits, a friend noticed a new brightness about him. The old zip was in him. When he commented on it, John said, "Oh, yes, I've been thanking the Lord all week for 'the blessed which.'" John went on to explain, "one day I got home late from work and had to rush to make a dinner appointment. I called to my wife from the shower and said, "Honey, get my suit out for me.' She hollered back "which?" I said, 'What?'

"Which? Which suit?"

"Suddenly I remembered all that I'd been forgiven of and all that I have - - - **ABUNDANTLY** have - - - and I started to laugh and cry and praise God all at once. My depression lifted. All week long I've thanked God for that blessed 'which'."

When we forget what God has done for us, we have little gratitude. When we remember, gratitude, coupled with joy, comes. Thankfulness and love become our response to God's graciousness towards us.

#### THIRSTY?

All of us are born thirsty. And all of us go through life trying to satisfy our thirst. Some try money and the things it can buy; others try power or sex. Some give up,

## PSALM 95

The Bay Psalm Book (1640)

O come, let us unto the Lord shout loud with singing voyce. To the rock of our saving health let us make joyfull noyse.

Before his presence let us then approach with thanksgiving" Also let us triumphantly

with Psalmes unto him sing.

(The first book to be printed in North America, the Bay Psalm Book was a collection of verse translations of the Psalms suitable for singing in worship. The aim of its authors, three Puritan ministers of the Massachusetts Bay Colony, was "fidelity rather than poetry." "If therefore the verses are not always so smooth and elegant as some may desire or expect," the preface said, "let them consider that God's Altar needs not our polishings.")
